## Chairman's Message



It is my privilege to serve ACCF as Chairman for the second year. It is an honour to be following the footsteps of our Founding Chairman Dr Peter Wong AM and subsequent distinguished Chairmen. I am very grateful for the support from our Corporate Sponsors - NAB Private, PWC and Invocare. I would like to take this opportunity to thank our Council Board members - Mr Eric Wong (Council Chairman), Mr Henry Tang (Council Secretary), Dr Amen Lee DBA (Hon) OAM JP, Mr Bernard Hor and Mr Tran Thang Phuoc.

Their principal role is to oversee and safeguard the movement of the Foundation's capital fund.

ACCF has two main events every year, namely the Annual Dinner and the Australian Chinese Charity Foundation & NSW Chinese Community New Year Celebration Dinner. Thanks to Dr Victor Tsang (Annual Dinner 2017) and Mrs Monica Chu (ACCF & NSW Chinese Community New Year Celebration Dinner 2018) who had successfully chaired these two events respectively. Their reports will record details of the events in greater depth.

However, I would like to specifically thank National Australia Bank for once again donating all their raffle ticket sales in the Bank's Lunar New Year celebrations in the states of New South Wales, Victoria, South Australia, Western Australia and Queensland. Total donations

received from National Australia Bank were \$27,420. In addition, ACCF matched their interstate donations dollar for dollar up to \$6000 for each state and the total was \$15,300. At the ACCF & NSW Chinese Community New Year Celebration Dinner on 24 February 2018, the Foundation raised \$42,280. All in all, a cheque of \$85,000 was presented to Lifeline Australia in support of their 24/7 crisis support and suicide prevention services to the Australian community.

On Sunday 18th March 2018, a raging fire swept through a small seaside town of Tathra on the NSW South Coast destroying 65 houses, 35 caravans and cabins and damaging another 48 homes. At this time of distress, Australian Chinese Charity Foundation donated \$20,000 to the Bega Valley Shire Council Mayoral Appeal Fund. The donation is to show to the victims of



the fire, the Rural Fire Services, the Fire and Rescue NSW and all the volunteers that we stand behind supporting them on their journey to rebuilding their lives. We also appeal to the broader Chinese community to support the Appeal Fund and that the Australian Chinese Community would stay side by side with other fellow Australians at times of needs.

ACCF is an open and inclusive charitable organisation. It is an honour to be working with a team of talented and committed committee members. Whilst experience is important, it is exciting to see a growing number of young people joining the Foundation and volunteer at our functions. I like to thank members of the Funds & Grants Assessment Committee – Dr Peter Wong

AM (Committee Chairman), Mrs Monica Chu, Ms Joanna Ng, Ms Ruby Teng, Mrs Gloria Cheung, Ms Stella Fan JP, Ms Cherie Kam JP, Ms Annie Tang JP, Ms Faith Tan and Ms Cecilia Tsai. I am also very grateful for the valuable contributions from the Investment sub-committee members – Mr Samuel Chu OAM (Sub-Committee Chairman), Dr Peter Wong AM, Mr Benjamin Chow AO and Mr Lloyd Lu.

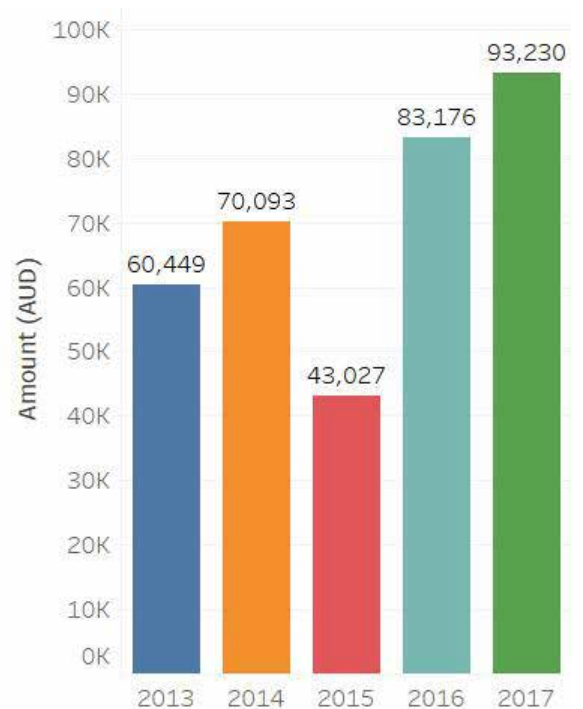

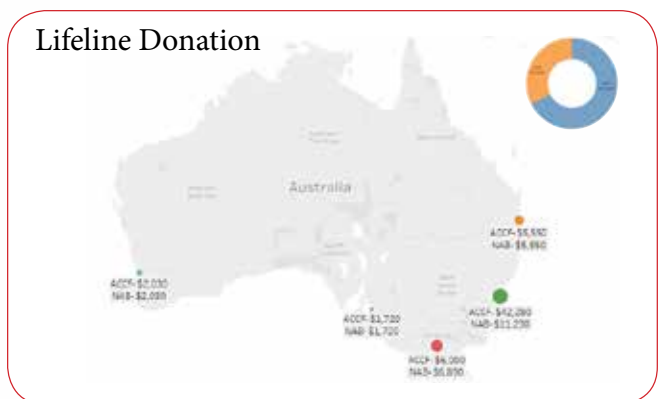

## **1 Summary of significant accounting policies**

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial report are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

### **(a) Basis of preparation**

#### *(i) Special purpose financial report*

The management committee has determined that the Australian Chinese Charity Foundation Inc. ("the Foundation") is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial reports.

This is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared for the sole purpose of complying with the *Associations Incorporation Act 1984 and Australian Charities and Not-for-Profit Commission (ACNC)* requirements to prepare and distribute a financial report to the members and must not be used for any other purpose. The management committee has determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of Australian Accounting standards, *Associations Incorporation Act 1984 and Australian Charities and Not-for-Profit Commission (ACNC) Act 2012*.

Australian Chinese Charity Foundation Inc. is a not-for-profit entity for the purpose of preparing the financial report.

#### *(ii) Historical cost convention*

The financial report is prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous year.

#### *(iii) Functional and presentation currency*

Items included in the financial statements are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Foundation operates ('the functional currency'). The financial statements are presented in Australian dollars, which is the Foundation's functional and presentation currency.

### **(b) Revenue recognition**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

The Foundation recognises revenue when the amount of revenue can be reliably measured, it is probable that future economic benefits will flow to the entity and specific criteria have been met for each of the Foundation's activities as described below.

#### *(i) Activity income*

Activity income relates to money received from the sale of tickets to dinners, auction items and raffle tickets. Activity income is recognised when cash is received or when the Foundation obtains the right to receive cash.

#### *(ii) Trusteeship income*

Trusteeship income is donations from trustees to the entity. Trusteeship income is recognised when received or when the Foundation obtains the right to receive the contribution.

#### *(iii) Donations*

Donations represent monies received into the Foundation's bank accounts. In common with most organisations dependent on such contributions, the Foundation is unable to establish control over voluntary donations prior to their initial entry into the accounting records. As such, donation income is recognised when received or when the Foundation obtains the right to receive the contribution, it is probable that the economic benefits comprising the contribution will flow to the entity and the amount of the contribution can be measured reliably.

## **1 Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)**

### **(b) Revenue recognition (continued)**

#### *(iv) Interest income*

Interest income is recognised using the effective interest method.

#### *(v) Donations in kind*

Donations in kind are not brought to account as revenue.

#### *(vi) Patron Income*

Patron income is donations from patrons to the entity. Patron income is recognised when received or when the Foundation obtains the right to receive the contribution.

### **(c) Income tax**

The Foundation is exempt from Income tax in accordance with Div 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*. Under this division, the Foundation is classified as a non-profit organisation.

### **(d) Cash and cash equivalents**

For the purpose of presentation in the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with financial institutions, other short-term, highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

### **(e) Receivables**

The recoverability of receivables is assessed at year end and specific provision is made for any doubtful accounts. The carrying amount of receivables approximates net fair value.

### **(f) Payables**

Liabilities are recognised for amounts to be paid in future for goods and services received. The carrying amount of payables approximates net fair value.

### **(g) Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

The Foundation has elected to treat the 2017 and 2016 Dinner Activities as input taxed fundraising events in accordance with subdivision 40 F of A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999.

### Our qualified opinion

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the *Basis for qualified opinion* section of our report, the accompanying financial report of Australian Chinese Charity Foundation (the Foundation) is in accordance with the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC) Act 2012*, including:

- (a) giving a true and fair view of the Foundation's financial position as at 31 December 2017 and of its financial performance for the year then ended
- (b) complying with Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note 1.

### What we have audited

The financial report comprises:

- the balance sheet as at 31 December 2017
- the statement of comprehensive income for the year then ended
- the statement of changes in equity for the year then ended
- the statement of cash flows for the year then ended
- the notes to the financial statements, which include a summary of significant accounting policies
- the declaration of the Management Committee.

### Basis for qualified opinion

Cash from donations and other fundraising activities are a significant source of revenue for the Foundation. The Management Committee have determined that it is impracticable to establish control over the collection of revenue from these sources prior to entry into its financial records. Accordingly, as the evidence available to us regarding revenue from cash donations and other fundraising activities was limited, our audit procedures with respect to revenue from these sources had to be restricted to the amounts recorded in the Foundation's financial records. As a result, we are unable to express an opinion as to whether revenue from cash donations and other fundraising activities is complete.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial report* section of our report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified opinion.

### Independence

We are independent of the Foundation in accordance with the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 *Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants* (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

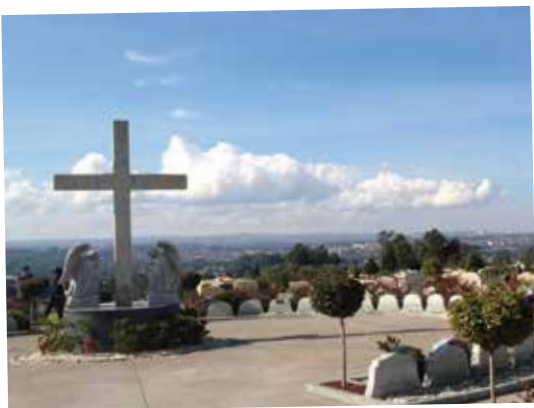
