ACCF announced annual funding recipients and the 2024 Chinese New Year celebration dinner

Sydney, 14th December 2023 – The Australian Chinese Charity Foundation (ACCF) is delighted to share two significant announcements during a media conference held on Thursday. The announcements include the unveiling of the successful recipients of ACCF's 2024 Funds and Grants, as well as details regarding the Annual ACCF & NSW Chinese Community New Year Celebration Dinner.

2023 ACCF Funds and Grants

ACCF's Funds & Grants Assessment Committee assesses and distributes ACCF's funds through three funding streams:

- 1. Emergency Assistance Fund supporting individuals in serious hardship with cash payment of up to \$1500 per eligible case.
- 2. Partnership program supporting projects that make a significant impact to contribute to a fair and equitable society. Projects may be paid for two or more years.
- 3. Community Projects Grant supporting initiatives that aim to improve the wellbeing of groups of people and the community.

The theme for our Community Projects grant this year is Homelessness, noting the extraordinary challenges faced by many.

"We received a strong number of expressions of interest including interstate and regional. After thoughtful consideration and assessment according to our criteria, 15 of these applications were successfully approved, awarding a total amount of \$138,550." stated Ms Cecilia Tsai, Chair of the Funds and Grants Assessment Committee.

Successful projects have demonstrated their compassion and ability to provide essential support and services to individuals experiencing homelessness or are at risk of becoming homeless.

"ACCF appreciates their efforts to address the increasingly severe homeless issues. With this funding, we hope the projects can deliver assistance to those in need to regain control of their lives."

All projects will be delivered in 2024 and will end in December 2024. A ceremonial cheque presentation will take place during ACCF's Annual Chinese New Year celebration banquet.
