# Chairman's Message



I am indeed humbled and honoured to be re-elected as the chairman of the Australian Chinese Charity Foundation Inc. (ACCF) for the year 2014-2015. It is an endorsement from our members and management on the effort I have put in to deliver the good work ACCF has been achieving throughout the year.

The year has gone by without much natural disaster until 13 March 2015, when cyclone Pam hit Vanuatu with wind speed of up to 320 km per hour. Nearly up to 90 % of the structures in Port Vila were damaged or destroyed. A state of emergency was declared for the Shefa Province including Port Vila, and an estimated 60,000 children were affected. ACCF launched an appeal on 1 April 2015 with Dr Michael Tse as the chairman. The aim of the appeal is to support Child Fund Australia's effort to rebuild schools and ensure safe, clean drinking water be made available as soon as possible. The appeal will close on 1 May 2015 and we will report on the results when it is available.

Our annual dinner was held on the eleventh of October 2014 and was highly successful and well attended by over 400 guests including dignitaries from both Federal and State Parliaments, Local Government Councillors, various Community organisation, media friends, Patrons, Trustees, members and supporters.

We inducted one new Trustee – Mrs Ellena Wong on

the night, who is a well known leader in the Lions Clubs Community in Sydney. It was nice to see more friends joining us to carry on our mission to help others. Our Annual Dinner is also an occasion for the Foundation to announce successful applicants for Community Project Funding. This year we had 21 successful applicants and we had distributed over \$70,000 (please refer to the Funds & Grants Assessment Committee report for details). I must acknowledge the dedication of Dr Michael Tse and his team including Mrs Eveline Chen, Mrs Maude Chin, Ms Cherie Kam, Ms Stella Fan, Miss Ruby Teng and Dr Victor Tsang in the assessment of Community Project Funding to many community organisations and emergency assistance to many individuals who are needy and in distress.

On 21 February 2015, we welcome the Year of the Goat at the annual ACCF & NSW Chinese Community New Year Celebration Dinner at Marigold Restaurant with lots of fun festivities. It was again well attended by over 370 guests and friends. The highlight of the evening was the arrival of the Prime Minister of Australia, the Hon. Tony Abbott accompanied by Mrs Maggie Abbott, they spent over two hours with us attending to lots of friendly supporters. We were overwhelmed by the support we received from our political leaders and the Consulate-General of the People's Republic of China in Sydney. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Chairman of the event Dr Michael Tse and his dedicated team in making the event such a huge success.

Major beneficiary for the evening was The Deb Bailey's Foundation Inc., and we raised \$30,000 to support their course in finding a cure for the Motor Neurone Disease. I would like to extend our warm welcome to our new sponsors Kellogg's and OSIM Australia for their kind donation and support to make the dinner an evening to remember.

We are also delighted to have a special performance by the Xuanlu Children's Choir for their lovely songs and they also delivered the national anthem before dinner started.

## BACKGROUND

ACCF was formed in 1990 as a broad based charity organisation to help the Australian community at large. It is supported by the generosity of patrons, trustees and a corporate trustee; life members and ordinary members; the dedication of a Management Committee and since 2009, a Council Board - all voluntary members who have worked consistently to achieve ACCF's aims and objectives and to extend ACCF's reach to many other charitable organisations.

## AIMS

The Australian Chinese Charity Foundation Inc (ACCF) is a non-political, non-profit and charitable organization. Its core aims and objectives are:

- To provide welfare services and financial assistance to people in need;
- To fund or otherwise provide support to charitable projects or non-profit organisations in Australia;
- To foster multiculturalism in the community; and
- To facilitate understanding between the Chinese community and the wider Australian community.

## DISASTER RESPONSES

ACCF has always responded quickly to natural disasters both in Australia and overseas by taking a leadership role in coordinating appeals within the Chinese community.

### In Australia, these have included:-

- NSW Bushfire Appeals in 1994 and 2001;
- Queensland Drought Relief – “Give Back to the Country” Appeal;
- Cyclone Larry Appeal;
- Victorian Bushfire Appeal in 2009 (together with other organisations, raised more than \$300,000);
- ACCF launched a joint campaign with TVBA and the Chinese media in 2011 for the North Queensland Flood Relief Appeal and \$262,000 was raised and;
- NSW Bushfire Appeal in 2013 and \$71,000 was raised

### Outside of Australia, ACCF’s disaster relief fundraising activities have included:-

- The Rwanda Appeal;
- Taiwan Earthquake Disaster Appeal;
- The East Timor Community Appeal;
- The Pakistan Earthquake Appeal;
- Snow storm in Inner Mongolia China;
- The Sichuan Earthquake Appeal;
- The China Flood Appeal;
- The Haiti Earthquake Appeal;
- The Christchurch Earthquake Appeal;
- The Indonesian Tsunami Appeal in 2004, ACCF together with other organisations raised over \$500,000. These donations were made

through Red Cross and World Vision Australia;

- The Sichuan Earthquake Appeal in 2013 (joint campaign with TVBA and Sing Tao Newspapers in Australia). All funds raised (\$151,519.39) was sent through World Vision Australia;
- \$22,700 was raised and presented to Child Fund Australia in 2014 to help the children in the Philippines as a result of typhoon Haiyan;
- Vanuatu Cyclone Pam Relief Appeal in 2015

The amount of funding for any application can be up to \$1,000. (see the Funds and Grants Assessment Committee Report 2014-2015).

## 1 Summary of significant accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial report are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

### (a) Basis of preparation

#### (i) Special purpose financial report

The management committee has determined that the Foundation is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial reports.

This is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared for the sole purpose of complying with the *Associations Incorporation Act 1984* requirements to prepare and distribute a financial report to the members and must not be used for any other purpose. The management committee have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act 1984* and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

- AASB 110 *Events after the Balance Sheet Date*,
- AASB 1031 *Materiality*.

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Committee have been applied.

The financial report contains only those disclosures considered necessary by the committees to meet the needs of the members. Australian Chinese Charity Foundation Inc is a not-for-profit entity for the purpose of preparing the financial report.

#### (ii) Historical cost convention

The financial report is prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non current assets. The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous year.

### (b) Revenue recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable.

The Foundation recognises revenue when the amount of revenue can be reliably measured, it is probable that future economic benefits will flow to the entity and specific criteria have been met for each of the Foundation's activities as described below.

#### (i) Dinner income

Dinner income relates to money received from sale of tickets auction items and raffle tickets.

#### (ii) Trusteeship income

Trusteeship income is donations from trustees to the entity.

#### (iii) Patron contributions

Patron contributions are donations received from patrons.

#### (iv) Donations

Donations represent monies received into the Foundation's bank accounts.



## 1 Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

### (b) Revenue recognition (continued)

#### (iv) Donations (continued)

In common with most organisations dependent on such contributions, the Foundation is unable to establish control over voluntary donations prior to their initial entry into the accounting records.

#### (v) Interest income

Interest income is recognised using the effective interest method.

#### (vi) Donations in kind

Donations in kind are not brought to account as revenue.

### (c) Income tax

The Foundation is exempt from Income tax in accordance with Div 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997. Under this division, the Foundation is classified as a non profit organisation.

### (d) Cash and cash equivalents

For the purpose of presentation in the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with financial institutions, other short-term, highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

### (e) Receivables

The recoverability of receivables is assessed at year end and specific provision is made for any doubtful accounts. The carrying amount of receivables approximates net fair value.

### (f) Payables

Liabilities are recognised for amounts to be paid in future for goods and services received. The carrying amount of payables approximates net fair value.

### (g) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The Foundation has elected to treat the 2014 and 2013 Dinner Activities as input taxed fundraising events in accordance with subdivision 40 F of A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999.

## **Live Below The Line**

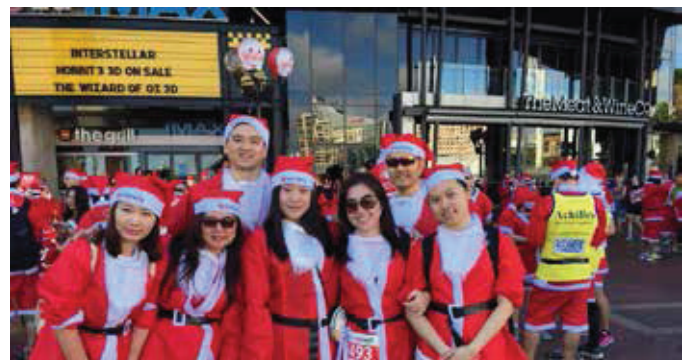

is to support individuals and families in emergency circumstances. In March 2015, an application for emergency funding was received from a family whose daughter with intellectual disability suddenly passed away. A grant of \$1000 was approved to assist in her funeral expenses.

On 13 March 2015, Vanuatu was hit by a category 5 cyclone Pam, the most severe cyclone in its history, resulting in wide spread destruction and loss of life. On Efate Island, where the capital Port Vila is located, an estimated 90% of structures are damaged or destroyed. A state of emergency has been declared for Shefa Province, including Port Vila. Australian Chinese Charity Foundation launched an appeal to support ChildFund Australia's effort to rebuild schools that have had their roofs ripped off in the cyclone and ensure safe, clean drinking water can be made available as soon as possible. The Appeal is current still in progress and will conclude on 1 May 2015.

Once again, I have the privilege of serving as the Chairman of the Funds & Grants Assessment Committee and am honoured to have the support and dedication from all the members of the Committee - Dr. Victor Tsang, Mrs Eve Chen, Mrs Maude Chin, Ms Cherie Kam, Miss Ruby Teng and Ms Stella Fan. I cannot ask for a better team and thank you. Let us continue to commit to the aims of ACCF and support the community at times of need.

# Funding Guidelines

## INTRODUCTION

The Australian Chinese Charity Foundation Inc. is a broad based community charity. Its major aims are:

- To help charitable/non-profit community organisations currently operating in New South Wales with specific projects and;
- To support individuals and families in emergency circumstances.

All project and emergency funding applications to the Foundation will be assessed by the Funds & Grants Assessment Committee. The Sub-Committee advises the Foundation about the nature of funding and the amount of assistance required.

THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES HAVE BEEN DEVELOPED TO ENABLE EQUITY IN FUNDING ALLOCATION:

## FUNDING CATEGORIES

### 1. EMERGENCY FUNDING

Applications may be made on the basis of the following categories:

- Victims of accidents and illness
- Special needs

#### ELIGIBILITY

Application must be referred by one of the following:

- A registered non-profit organisation;

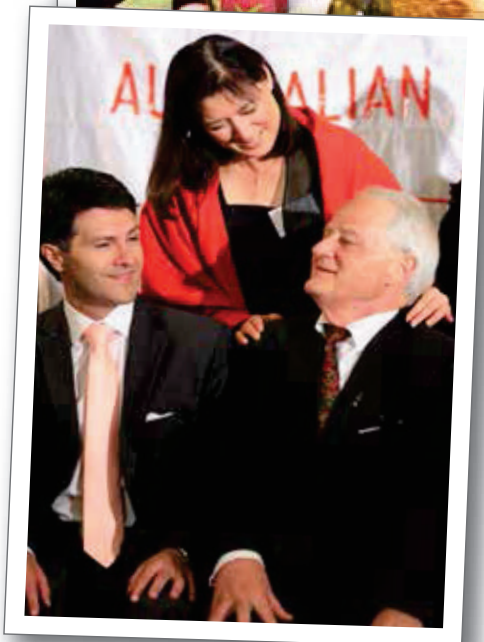

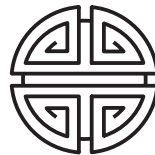
