2025 FLOOD RELIEF APPEAL

The May 2025 sudden record flooding in NSW mid-north coast has caused immense hardship for our community. Many businesses and family homes have been inundated with thousands still isolated without food and power.

Australian Chinese Charity Foundation (ACCF) wishes to extend our helping hand to those affected communities. We are raising a Flood Relief Appeal and the Salvation Army is chosen to be the beneficiary organization. At present, they are running 13 evacuation centres at Church Halls, Community Halls and Clubs at the flood affected areas providing emergency meals and essential supplies, financial and counselling support, coordination with government and different agencies such as Food Banks and SES. Gradually, they will be moving into assisting the recovery mode as families are starting to move back into their flood affected household as the rain eases off. Apart from donating \$50,000 from ACCF to Salvation Army,

Hudson Chen KC*HS Memorial Grant also donate \$10,000 to support the affected people in rebuilding their homes. We were grateful to all following organisations and individuals to participate in this Relief effort. In total, \$71,000 was donated to Salvation Army.


