ACCF 35th Anniversary Charity Gala Dinner

The Australian Chinese Charity Foundation (ACCF) proudly celebrated its 35th Anniversary Charity Gala Dinner on Saturday, 25 October 2025, at The Fullerton Hotel, Sydney. The milestone event attracted over 300 distinguished guests, including guests of honour, representatives from Federal and State Parliament, and officials from the HKETO in Sydney, demonstrating the strong support to ACCF across government and the wider community.

The evening marked 35 years of dedicated service and meaningful community impact; while honouring the visionary founders and past leaders whose foresight and commitment established the strong foundation of the organisation. Their legacy continues to guide and inspire ACCF's mission to serve the community with compassion and purpose.

A major highlight of the Gala Dinner was the announcement of 23 successful community projects awarded funding under the ACCF 2025–2026 Community Grants Program, with a total allocation of \$150,000. These grants will support initiatives focused on Youth, Aged Care, and Special Needs, reinforcing ACCF's ongoing commitment to community wellbeing.

During the event, ACCF also made a \$40,000 donation to support a Medical Research Project at the ANZAC Research Institute, Sydney Local Health District. This innovative project has developed a novel blood test to identify patients at high risk of developing dangerous blood clots, enabling personalised preventative treatments for heart attack and stroke.

The Gala Dinner provided an important platform for community leaders and supporters to connect, reaffirm shared values, and strengthen future collaboration in advancing ACCF's charitable work.

ACCF sincerely thanks all guests, sponsors, donors, volunteers, and supporters for their generosity and support, which made this milestone celebration a resounding success. Together, ACCF looks forward to continuing its mission and creating a lasting positive impact in the years ahead.




Salvation Army Award & Appreciation Luncheon
