## A Memorable Journey

The Chinese community in Australia has a rich history spanning over 200 years. It was firmly established by the mid-19th century, especially during the gold rush era, laying strong roots that have flourished ever since.

In recent decades, thousands of Chinese nationals have come to Australia—not only as visitors but as students, professionals, and new members of this vibrant society. The federal government’s education export drive in 1987 attracted thousands of students, many of whom were from China.

In June 1989, a historic and challenging moment unfolded: 40,000 Chinese students found themselves stranded in Australia amid political turmoil at home. Many arrived with limited financial resources, faced a tough job market, and lacked support from their families overseas.

While the Australian government and the Chinese community showed compassion and assistance, there was no central organization equipped to provide sustained financial support. Recognising this urgent need, with the help of community leaders and the Australian Taxation Office—especially Mr. Terry Bates—a new, broad-based, apolitical charitable organisation was founded on 20 November 1990. This was the birth of the Australian Chinese Charity Foundation (ACCF).

The ACCF’s mission was clear: to foster love, care, and harmony in Australia’s culturally diverse community by supporting nonprofits and individuals in need.

The response was immediate and inspiring. Within just a few months, ACCF had 20 committed trustees, each pledging \$10,000. This impressive group included esteemed leaders such as Frank Chou OAM, Thuoc Thang Tran OAM, Oai Trieu (a celebrated poet and pensioner), Ms. Katie Young, Dr. Cyril Wong, William Yee, Ricky Char, Bernard Chan, Robert Ho OAM, Hudson Chen OAM, and King Fong OAM. Generous patrons like Francis Chan and Denis Low each donated \$50,000, providing ACCF a solid foundation to grow.

Thanks to the Hon. Dr Helen Sham Ho OAM JP, who introduced eight trustees, the foundation rapidly expanded its reach and impact.

The Inauguration Dinner, held at the prestigious Mandarin Club, was graced by the Governor of NSW, Peter Sinclair AC, as Guest of Honour—a testament to the foundation’s significance.

Shortly after, ACCF formed its first Grant Subcommittee, with dedicated members including Rev. Charles Cheung, Rev. Able Chung, Philippa McIntosh, Lee Ming, and Captain Ling from the Salvation Army as Chairperson.

With unwavering commitment from its members, ACCF has flourished over the decades. Beyond charitable works, ACCF proudly promotes Australia’s cultural diversity through memorable events.

In 1991, at the invitation of Governor Sinclair AC, ACCF hosted a full-day garden party and concert at Government House, complete with vibrant dragon and lion parades that captured the spirit of multicultural Australia.

From 1993 to 1997, ACCF launched the popular ‘Festival of Nations’ — a multicultural concert initially held at Bicentennial Park, later moving to Tumbalong Park in Darling Harbour, celebrating the rich tapestry of cultures in Australia.

Over the years, ACCF has partnered with many Chinese communities to raise vital funds for disaster relief, including the recent floods in NSW, earthquakes in China, tsunamis in Asia, and devastating bushfires in Victoria. We owe a special debt of gratitude to leaders such as Robert Ho OAM, Hudson Chen OAM, and Maude Chin for their dedication.

In 2018, under the leadership of Monica Chu OAM, the ACCF Legacy Fund was established to further strengthen ACCF’s objective of supporting those most in need. Legacy Fund donors are able to name their funds and nominate cohorts who benefit from their fund. Currently, there are four Legacy donors— the St Luke Fund (for youth & disabilities), the Pak Family Fund (for victims and survivors of domestic violence), the Faith Family Fund (for emergency assistance) and the ANSA Family Fund (for elderly).

Many names remain unmentioned here, but on behalf of ACCF, I extend heartfelt thanks to every member, donor, and supporter who has been part of this extraordinary journey.

As we proudly celebrate the 35th anniversary of the Australian Chinese Charity Foundation, we look forward with excitement and hope. The next 35 years will be just as inspiring as we pass the baton to the next generation of visionary leaders.

**Will you join us on this exciting and rewarding journey? Together, we can continue to build a compassionate, inclusive, and vibrant community—one where every act of kindness creates a ripple of positive change.**

The Australian Chinese Charity Foundation (ACCF) is an inspiring example of the power of community. For 35 years, they have been raising vital funds for people in need, supporting charitable projects and non-profit organisations, and nurturing cross-cultural exchange and understanding.

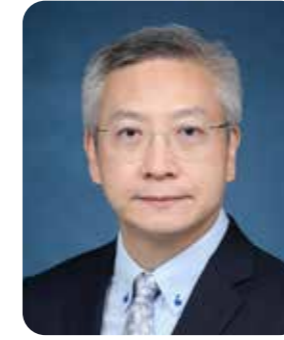

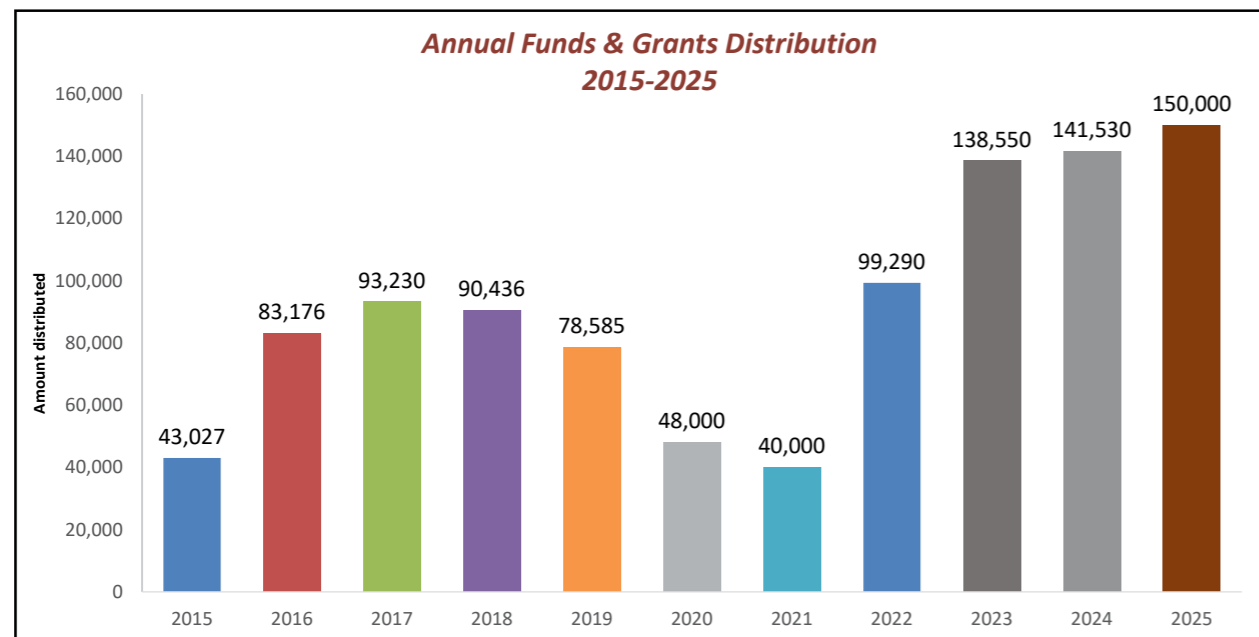

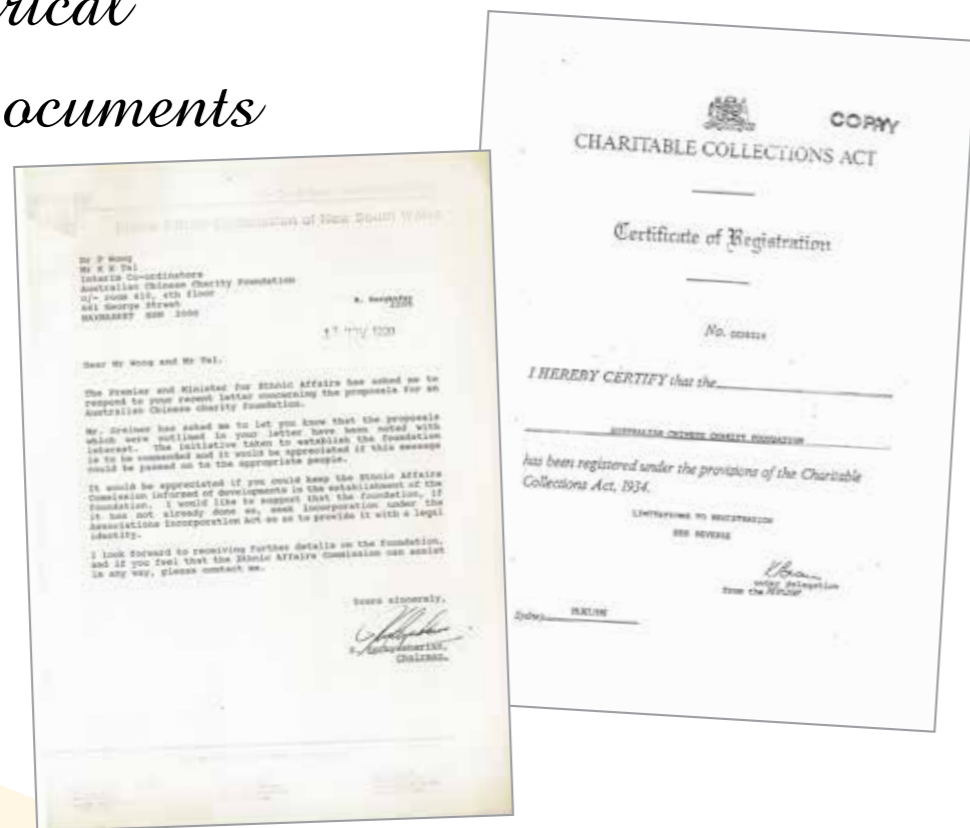

One of the most significant milestones in the 35-year history of the Australian Chinese Charity Foundation (ACCF) was the launch of the ACCF Legacy Fund on 20 June 2018 at the NSW Parliament House. The event was honoured by the presence of the then NSW Premier, the Hon Gladys Berejiklian MP, and the then Minister for Multiculturalism and Disability Services, the Hon Ray Williams MP, reflecting strong support for the Foundation's mission.

The Legacy Fund was established under the leadership of Dr Peter Wong AM, Founder of ACCF, with the guiding motto:

*“Let your loving heart become an eternal blessing.”*

This initiative was designed to ensure lasting support for those in need, by creating a capital-conserved fund where the principal remains untouched and the income is distributed annually to charitable causes.

What makes the Legacy Fund unique is the opportunity for donors to create named funds that reflect their personal values, honour loved ones, or support specific community needs. This allows donors to leave a meaningful legacy that continues to give, year after year.

At its launch, three founding legacy funds were established by long-standing supporters of ACCF with an additional fourth member joined in 2022:

- **The St Luke Fund** – Supporting youth and individuals with disabilities
- **The Pak Family Fund** – Assisting victims and survivors of domestic violence
- **The Faith Family Fund** – Initially focused on elderly care, now directed toward emergency needs
- **The ANSA Family Fund** – focuses on supporting elderly individuals in hardship

Each year, income from the Legacy Fund is distributed through ACCF's Annual Grants Program, delivering much-needed assistance to vulnerable groups across the community. These funds have made a measurable difference and will continue to do so for generations to come.

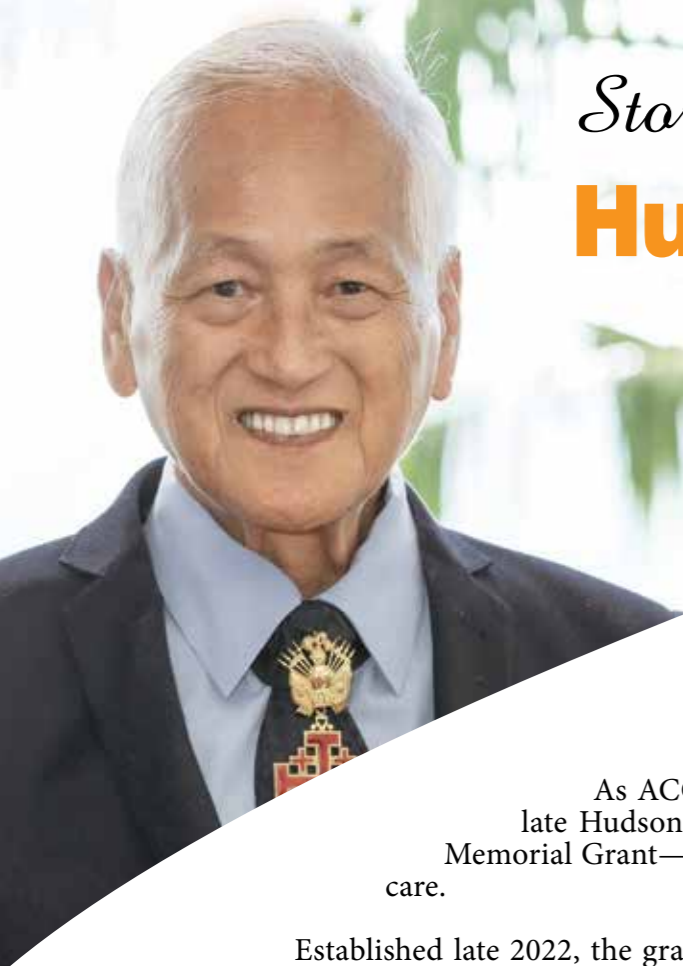

As ACCF celebrates 35 years of service, we proudly honour the late Hudson Chen KC\*HS OAM through the Hudson Chen KC\*HS Memorial Grant—a lasting tribute to a life devoted to generosity, unity, and care.

Established late 2022, the grant was made possible by a bequest gift of \$100,000 from Mr Chen's estate, facilitated by Eve Chen. An additional \$5,000 was later added totalling \$105,000 reflecting the Chen family's deep commitment to community welfare.

Mr Chen was a distinguished past Chairman of ACCF, serving two terms between 2004–2007 and 2010–2013. A passionate fundraiser, he led ACCF through pivotal moments including the Indian Ocean Tsunami, Taiwan Earthquake, and Victoria Bushfires. His leadership mobilised support and delivered meaningful aid, reinforcing ACCF's role as a compassionate force in times of crisis.

Since its establishment, the Hudson Chen KC\*HS Memorial Grant has supported a range of impactful causes:

- NSW Flood Appeal (2022)
- Youth Off The Streets – 2023 Annual Dinner beneficiary
- Refugee Council of Australia – 2024 Annual Dinner beneficiary
- The Salvation Army – support for NSW Mid-North Coast flood recovery
- Medical Research Project, ANZAC Research Institute, Sydney Local Health District -2025 Annual Dinner beneficiary

The Gala Dinner was well attended with over 300 guests, members and community friends. This year, our beneficiary is “Medical Research Project - ANZAC Research Institute, Sydney Local Health District”.

Each year in Australia, over 57,000 heart attacks and 27,000 strokes occur, costing the healthcare system \$12.7 billion, with an additional \$26 billion lost to premature death and reduced wellbeing.

- A stroke or heart attack can be life-changing—not only for the individual, but for their family—leading to long-term disability, emotional distress, and loss of independence.
- For the community, these events drive billions in healthcare costs, lost productivity, and strain on health care including aged care and support services.

The Platelet and Thrombosis Research Lab at the ANZAC Research Institute has developed a novel blood test that predicts which patients are at high risk of developing dangerous blood clots—we hope this can enable future personalised treatment to prevent heart attack and stroke. A positive test result guides clinicians to escalate therapy and reduce recurrence, while a negative test helps avoid unnecessary treatment and its side effects.

Originally developed for patients with chronic blood cancers, who are at particularly high risk of clotting, this test shows promise for broader use across cardiovascular care. With the support of ACCF and the Hudson Chen Memorial Fund, they aim to validate and implement this test across clinical settings, helping prevent thousands of heart attacks and strokes every year —transforming prevention and saving lives.

As a medical Research, they rely significantly upon the generosity of the community and corporate Australia to support their life changing programs. With everyone’s great support and generosity on the evening; together with the Hudson Chen Memorial Fund; we have successful raised and donated \$40,000 to them. Medical Research Project – ANZAC Research Institute, Sydney Local Health District

This project is all about helping people live longer, healthier lives. Heart attacks and strokes affect thousands of Australians every year, often without warning. They don't just impact individuals—they change the lives of families, carers, and entire communities. That's why we're so excited about this new blood test developed by the Platelet and Thrombosis Research Lab at the ANZAC Research Institute. It can help identify people who are at high risk of developing dangerous blood clots, so doctors can step in early and prevent serious events like heart attacks and strokes.

What makes this test so powerful is that it's not just about treating illness—it's about preventing it. A positive result means doctors can act quickly to protect someone's health. A negative result means they can avoid unnecessary medications and side effects. It's a smarter, more personalised way to care for people, and it could make a real difference—especially in communities where access to early diagnosis and tailored treatment isn't always easy.

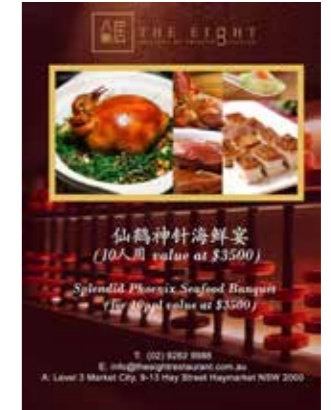

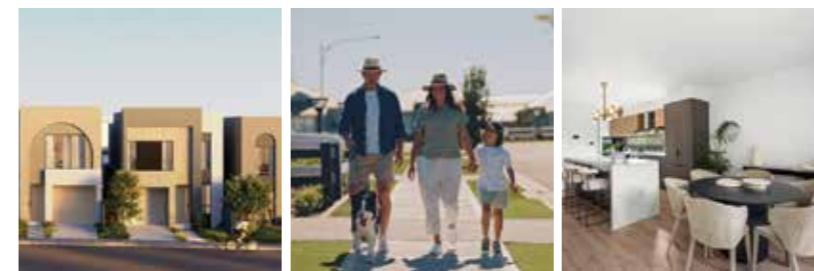

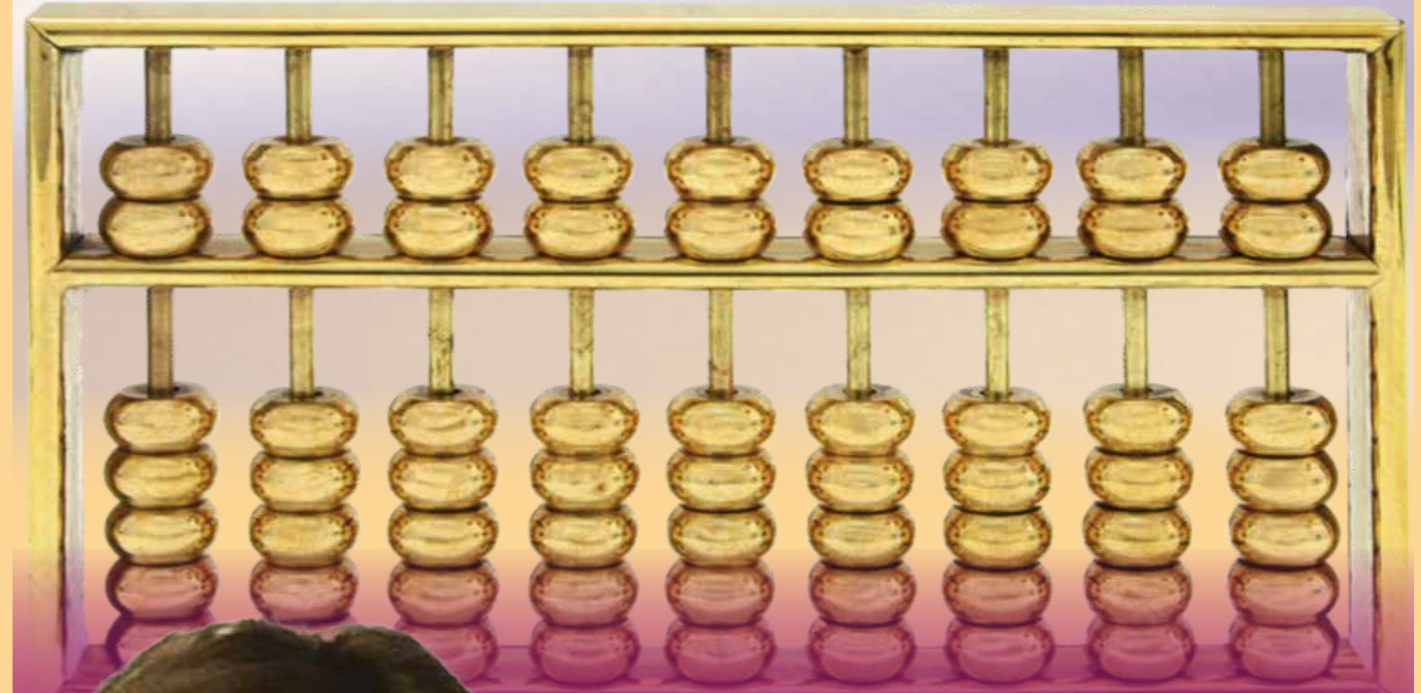
